## A prayer of David.

<sup>1</sup> Hear me, LORD, and answer me, for I am poor and needy. <sup>2</sup> Guard my life, for I am faithful to you; save your servant who trusts in you. You are my God; <sup>3</sup> have mercy on me, Lord, for I call to you all day long. <sup>4</sup> Bring joy to your servant, Lord, for I put my trust in you.

<sup>5</sup> You, Lord, are forgiving and good, abounding in love to all who call to you. <sup>6</sup> Hear my prayer, LORD; listen to my cry for mercy. <sup>7</sup> When I am in distress, I call to you, because you answer me. <sup>8</sup> Among the gods there is none like you, Lord; no deeds can compare with yours.

<sup>9</sup> All the nations you have made will come and worship before you, Lord; they will bring glory to your name. <sup>10</sup> For you are great and do marvelous deeds; you alone are God. <sup>11</sup> Teach me your way, LORD, that I may rely on your faithfulness; give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name. <sup>12</sup> I will praise you, Lord my God, with all my heart; I will glorify your name forever. <sup>13</sup> For great is your love toward me; you have delivered me from the depths, from the realm of the dead.
